#### **#ATTENDANCEMATTERS - THANK YOU!**

As we come to the end of the school year, we're proud to share that our whole school attendance stands at 87.1%, which is an increase of 1.9% from this time last year. This improvement has had a real impact—more pupils have been able to achieve their EHCP objectives, take part in educational visits, and benefit from support by visiting professionals such as Speech and Language Therapists (SALT) and Occupational Therapists (OT).

Thanks to improved attendance, more pupils have also enjoyed Music of Life sessions, taken part in active sports workshops, and joined in with lunchtime clubs alongside their peers.

We'd like to say a huge thank you to all our families for your continued support in helping improve attendance. By working together, we're giving every child the best chance to thrive and achieve their full potential.




#### SQUIRRELS MAKE A SPLASH AT WYNDLEY LEISURE CENTRE!
