### BRIDGE TO THE FUTURE - WINTER FUN AND ADVENTURES!

At The Bridge School, we want every child to be happy, healthy, and curious about the world around them. That's why we've introduced 'Bridge to the Future'—a set of 50 fun enrichment activities designed to help children play, explore, and experience new things. These activities give pupils the chance to try things they might not normally do. They're all about building confidence, developing new skills, and making happy memories. Many activities link to our local area and encourage teamwork, creativity, and kindness. They also support wellbeing and character development, helping children grow into confident, caring individuals.

Children will record their achievements and earn certificates as they complete more activities—making learning fun and rewarding!

This term, we're inviting pupils (and families!) to take part in some exciting winter activities you can try at home or in the community:

### **BRILLIANT BUTTERFLIES**

This term, the Butterflies have had so much fun exploring and learning through play!

We've enjoyed lots of hands-on activities with numbers and exploring heavy and light objects, helping the children begin to notice differences in size and weight during play. One of our favourite experiences was exploring ice—the children loved feeling the cold, and watching it melt.

During our story sessions, we focused on helping the children engage with stories in ways that suited their individual needs. Some children explored sequencing simple parts of a story using pictures, noticing what happens first and next. Others enjoyed looking at the pictures, listening to sounds and words, and sharing attention with adults, building early story awareness through sensory and interactive experiences. These activities supported curiosity, communication, and enjoyment of books in a fun and meaningful way.

A big highlight was our Christmas role-play area! The children absolutely loved pretending to be chefs, mixing, stirring, and "cooking" festive treats. This gave them lots of opportunities for imaginative play, turn-taking, and using new words.



We are so proud of how curious and engaged the Butterflies have been this term. Well done, everyone!





### **BADGERS**

This half term Badgers have been focusing on encouraging a love for reading through using engaging interactive books. The children have explored sensory stories such as That's not my penguin!, That's not my elf!, and That's not my Santa!. They have thoroughly enjoyed the touchy-feely textures and the use of symbols connected to each story, which has helped make reading a multi-sensory and meaningful experience.

It's wonderful to see their excitement as they discover new words and textures through the use of interactive books with flaps!

### **OPTIMISTIC OWLS**

The Optimistic Owls have had a wonderful half term engaging in new and exciting learning linked to our 'Winter Wonderland' topic. In English, we began by exploring the exciting narrative of 'Lost and Found' and created and performed a five-sentence story using our senses and Makaton. We then explored the video of 'The Bear and The Hare' through engaging with sensory stories, role-play and Arts and Crafts. We loved making our own winter wonderland tuff trays exploring what the animals would have experienced within the story.

In Maths, we have been developing our knowledge of Place Value exploring numbers up to 100. We have also been engaging with practical activities linked to Money to help us build important life skills when paying for things and calculating how much items cost. In Science and Geography, we have loved exploring the Weather and the four seasons, we especially enjoyed dressing up to match different weather descriptions and exploring the four seasons through sensory tubes. In Art, we have explored some of the fantastic winter-themed work of Monet and we attempted to create our own Winter artwork.

Owls have also enjoyed a range of extra-curricular activities including weekly PE sessions engaging in activities linked to target practice, climbing, jumping, passing and scoring. We have also loved attending weekly music sessions on a Friday, learning how to explore the music piece 'Winter Lament'. Our class has actively engaged with and enjoyed a range of Topic based learning including activities linked to Children in Need, Anti-Bullying Week, Remembrance and Christmas!

We have had a super first term and are looking forward to new and exciting learning and opportunities in the new year! Miss Jenkins and the Optimistic Owls.
















### **SQUIRRELS**

They have continued with their weekly walk out into the environment where they have focussed on different aspects of the maths curriculum, along with learning essential life skills to help them to become more confident and independent. They have focussed on a different theme each week to enhance their learning in the classroom.

They have visited NBC Gymnastics and had an amazing time using their equipment to explore their senses. It was lovely to see all children being able to access lots of different types of apparatus that they would not ordinarily be able to do.

Along with learning about shape and positional language, Hedgehogs have continued working hard with their number work. They have also continued with their hard work on communication. They have been signing more during the school day, using Makaton, particularly during the morning greeting and during Phonics lessons.

It really has been a great pleasure to see the progress that all of the children have made this term, and how much more confident they are becoming. We all look forward to seeing more progress in the New Year and the continuation of many happy faces.

### **FANTASTIC FOXES**

The children in Fantastic Foxes have had a wonderful time getting creative during our Winter Wonderland topic, which has now led into some festive Christmas crafts.
